WHEREAS the Rural Municipality of Edward serving Local Improvement District No. 1 (Pierson) has applied to The Public Utilities Board for approval of By-law No. 1/2000 to revise the schedule of water and sewer rates of the said Municipality, and after public notice of the application - no persons signifying their desire to make representation in the matter;

AND WHEREAS the Board notes that the utility rate study which accompanied the application provided for a sum of money to be placed in a utility reserve account, and the Board therefore desires to ensure that these moneys be expended in an appropriate fashion;

AND WHEREAS the Board deems it expedient to do so;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

1. By-law No. 1/2000 of the Rural Municipality of Edward serving Local Improvement District No. 1 (Pierson) BE AND THE SAME IS HEREBY APPROVED;

- 2. The water and sewer rates set forth in Schedule "A" hereto shall apply to all customers of the utility effective on the next billing in the normal course after the date of this Order.
- 3. This Order is subject to moneys being expended from the utility reserve fund only to support existing infrastructure, unless the Board has authorized the expenditure pursuant to Section 168 of The Municipal and Various Acts Amendment Act, c. 58.

Minimum Charge will be the same for each meter size as shown above, but the sewer Commodity Charge will be excluded.

3. Service to Customers Outside L.I.D. Limits

The Council of the R. M. of Edward may sign agreements with customers for the provision of water and sewer services to properties located outside the legal boundaries of the L.I.D. such agreements shall provide for payment of the appropriate rates set out in the schedule, as well as a surcharge, set by resolution of Council, which shall be equivalent to the frontage levy, general taxes and special taxes for utility purposes in effect at the time, or may be in effect from time to time, and which would be levied on the property concerned if it were within these boundaries. In addition, all costs of connecting to the utility's mains and installing and maintaining service connections will be paid by the consumer.

4. <u>Billings and Penalties</u>

Accounts shall be billed quarterly, and shall be due and payable 30 days after date of billing. A penalty of 5% of the amount of the bill shall be added if not paid by the due date.

5. Disconnection

Service may be disconnected and discontinued immediately and without further notice in the event of non-payment of the account within 30 days after the due date.

6. Reconnection

A customer who has had his services disconnected for any reason shall not be reconnected until all regulations have been complied with, and all arrears paid, as well as any penalties and reconnection costs, being actual costs incurred.

7. <u>Outstanding Bills</u>

Pursuant to Section 236(1)(b) of The Municipal Act, the amount of all outstanding charges for water and sewer service are a lien and charge upon the land serviced, and shall be collected in the same manner in which ordinary taxes upon the land are collectible, and with like remedies.

8. <u>Hydrant Rentals</u>

The customer shall pay to the utility an annual rental of \$75.00 for each hydrant connected to the system.
