## Schedule A

Manitoba Keewatinowi Okimakanak Inc. (MKO) represents approximately 65,000 Treaty First Nation citizens in northern Manitoba. MKO has been in existence for over 32 years and is a nonprofit advocacy organization governed by the elected Chiefs of the 30 sovereign First Nations in northern Manitoba.

The citizens of the MKO First Nations are residential ratepayers and the First Nation Governments are general service ratepayers. The three diesel First Nations which pay electricity bills for the schools are also First Nation Education Rate customers.

All of the citizens of the MKO First Nations and the MKO First Nation government facilities receive electricity service solely from Manitoba Hydro and all are Manitoba Hydro customers.

In this proceeding MKO will seek to represent the interests of its members in each one of its consumer categories. To that end MKO will be seeking to have its members segregated into separate classes all of which will have one common denominator and that being that they are first nations ratepayers in Hydro affected areas. To that end MKO will be looking to have assets and costs allocated to those classes based on the applicability of the allocation to those classes. Specifically MKO will be seeking to remove the allocation of any mitigation costs to these classes and to remove the allocation of any government taxes or quasi-taxes on water or water rights.

MKO will also be interested in Terms and conditions especially as they relate to hookups and cut-offs in their communities.

Another area of concern is the applicability of rate mitigation to these new specific classes based upon inability to afford current or proposed future rates.
