

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MOUNTAIN - BIRCH RIVER UTILITY

October 4, 2012

The Rural Municipality of Mountain (RM) applied to the Public Utilities Board (Board) for revised rates for the Birch River Water and Sewer Utility (Utility) as set out in By-law No. 01/12 read the first time on February 8, 2012. A Public Notice was issued on March 20, 2012. Due to the public response to the Notice, the Board will convene a Public Hearing.

A Public Hearing will be held: Wednesday, November 14, 2012

Doors open at **6:30 p.m**. Meeting to begin at **7:00 p.m**.

Due to an urgent need for increased revenues, the Board approved new rates effective July 1, 2012 on an interim *ex parte* basis. Rates had last been amended in 2006 and the Utility has been experiencing recurring deficits.

In reviewing the submission, the Board was made aware that deficits for 2009, 2010 and 2011 totaled \$81,280. Recovery of this deficit will form part of the Hearing. The RM has requested that recovery be spread over 5 years and that it be achieved through a special taxation levy. The Board will hear opinions as to whether this should be recovered from all taxpayers or from Utility customers. If the latter method is chosen, the quarterly rate rider on the Utility bill would be approximately \$28.50 from January 1, 2013 to December 31, 2017.

Further, and subsequent to their initial rate proposal, the RM submitted a revision to the requested rates. Previous, interim and newly proposed rates are shown below.
