**NOTICE OF APPLICATION
INITIAL WASTEWATER DISPOSAL

The Town of Minnedosa has applied to the Public Utilities Board for initial Wastewater Treatment Lagoon Fees for Septic Haulers for 2013 as set out in By-law No.2517, read the first time on May 22, 2012. The proposed rates are provided:

Details of the Town’s application are available for review at the Town’s office or The Public Utilities Board’s office. Questions concerning the application for revised rates, or the operation of the Utility, should be addressed to the Town.

The Public Utilities Board is the provincial regulatory agency that reviews and approves rates for municipal water and sewer utilities. The Board’s review process involves:

- the Utility filing a rate application to the Board,
- the public notification of proposed rate changes,
- the Board’s review of the application through a public hearing or paper review process, and
- the issuance of a Board Order which outlines the Board’s decision on the rate application and the rates to be charged.

The Board will then decide whether any further notice is required and whether to proceed with a public hearing or paper review process. All concerns received by the Board will be considered in the Board's decision on rates to be charged.

PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT IN CONSIDERING THIS APPLICATION, THE PUBLIC UTILITIES BOARD MAY OR MAY NOT FIND IT NECESSARY TO DETERMINE RATES DIFFERENT FROM THOSE APPLIED FOR BY THE APPLICANT.
