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NOTICE OF INTERIM RATES
 The Village of Waskada Water and Sewer Utility

June 26, 2012

The Village of Waskada (Village) has applied to the Public Utilities Board (Board) for revised water and sewer rates as set out in By-law No. 3-2012, read the first time on February 6, 2012. By Order No. 85/05 the Board approved rates for 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007.

By Order No. 71/12 released June 6, 2012, the Board has now granted an interim rate change on an ex parte basis for 2012. At the time of this Notice the Village was completing a detailed rate study. Upon review of this detailed rate study, the Board will consider setting revised rates for 2013.

The current and the proposed commodity rates are noted below:

The Public Utilities Board is the provincial regulatory agency that reviews and approves rates for municipal water and sewer utilities.
